
Year 11 - Understanding my report

Firstly, you will receive a report 3 times per year (unless you are in year 11 as they only get 2), one for each term. Two of these reports will be an interim report, and one will combine an interim report with sept tutor comments. The report you will receive will look like this.



Targets and Grades.

- Students in Year 11 already have end of key stage 4 target from the grade scale based on prior attainment.
- Grade scale 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 for GCSE courses
- Grade scale -P1,M1,D1,P2,M2,D2,D* for equivalent GCSE courses
- Student undertakes 2 mock assessments, 1 each term.
- Assessments are graded using the grades above.
- Results are recorded on reports
- Students should begin to make progress towards target grade. The 3 columns on the report indicate whether progress is being made.
- By the end of the academic year, it is hoped that students will have made sufficient progress to reach their target grade in the external summer examination series.

The report is divided up in to following areas, identified by the numbered dots.

- **1** In this column you will find the subject your child studies.
- 2 This column is your child's end of year target. It is calculated from prior attainment
- 3 and 4 These columns show your child's attitude towards learning and their homework effort in each subject.
- **5** The current grade that your child is working at. The grade scale for your child is U,1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 With 1 being the lowest and 9 being the highest for GCSE or P1,M1,D1,P2,M2,D2,D* with P1 being the lowest and D* the highest for a GCSE equivalent qualification.
- **6** This shows your child's progress in each subject. This is calculated by comparing their current grade and how far it is from achieving their target grade.
- **7** We report this 3 times per year. (assessment schedule)
- 8 The report key what each colour and number represents.
- 9 Shows your child's attendance to date, the number of merits awarded and the number of detentions they have been set from the beginning of the year.
- 10 Attendance per term.
